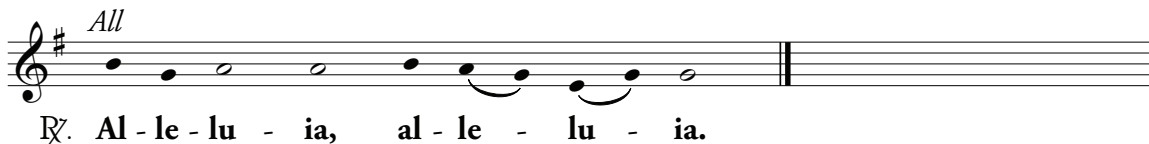
Antiphon, sung by the cantor: Jesus said: Do not be afraid. Go and tell my brothers to set out for Galilee; there they will see me, alleluia.

℟. **Son of the living God, bless Your people.**

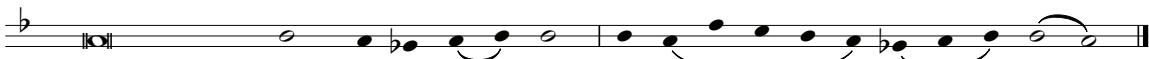
THE OUR FATHER
